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CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

June is the month for the Singapore Festival of Arts. It is time again to celebrate.

Despite the economic slowdown in the region, support from corporate sponsors remains strong. So, for 5 pulsating weeks, from 28 May to 28 June, the Festival will showcase an array of exciting international artists and local talents.

The core programme will feature 32 groups in 95 high quality performances; fringe festival will present another 400 or more activities and performances. The Festival is for people of all ages and different artistic tastes.

A number of internationally acclaimed groups will make their appearances. The noteworthy ones include St. Petersburg Philharmonic Orchestra, America's famous dance company Twyla Tharp, Australia's modern Circus Oz, Taiwan's renowned Cloud Gate Dance Company, PRC's Shanghai Beijing Opera Theatre and the British Royal Shakespeare Company. During the Festival, the New York Philharmonic (NYP) will make a much welcome return to Singapore for the third time as part of the NYP Citibank 1998 Asia tour.

Don't miss out the premiere performances by our home-grown talents - TheatreWorks, The Necessary Stage, The Theatre Practice, The ETCeteras with Drama Box and Toy Factory Theatre Ensemble, Singapore Dance Theatre, Singapore Chinese Orchestra & Siong Leng Musical Association, PA Indian Dance Group and the Combined Malay groups of Sriwana, Tedja Timor and Pesilat Singapura. Joyce Koh's new composition "Tai" will be performed by the Singapore Symphony Orchestra.

A conscious attempt has been made to have more Asian artists, hence a higher Asian content in the Festival. The result: 47% Asian and 53% non-Asian groups.

The Festival will have a number of cutting-edge productions. Avant garde artists such as Ensemble Karel, Michel Lemieux and Victor Pilon as well as Theatre Uzura will offer a new experience in performing arts to the Singapore audience. Of course, the staple fare of mainstream orchestral music, traditional Chinese opera and straight theatre will

Not to be missed is the special exhibition 'The Origins of Modern Art in France: 1880 -1939' at the Singapore Art Museum. It will feature over 50 paintings including the work of Picasso, Degas, Monet, and Van Gogh loaned from 20 French museums.


The Festival Village will run for 4 consecutive evenings at Fort Canning. Just like the Festival of Asian Performing Arts last year, organiser WOMAD (World of Music, Arts and Dance) will bring together performing arts from around the world. Look out for the world renowned tabla player Zakir Hussain, Tibetan vocalist Yungchen Lhamo; Chinese flautists Guo Yue and Guo Yi; Shooglenifty from Scotland; and the haunting voice of Marta Sebestyen from Hungary. The Festival Village is a must for families.

There is something for everyone in the eclectic fringe activities - at shopping complexes, MRT stations, public parks and HDB neighbourhood town centres. Most are free of charge. Highlights include the open air screening of films at Millenia Walk, Animation Fiesta at Jubilee Hall, Jazz in the Park at Botanic Gardens, traditional opera series at Bras Basah Park, arts activities at Waterloo Arts District and Fringe for Kids at Substation and Drama Centre. Orchard Road will be dressed up for the Festival Parade on 31 May 98.

For the first time, tickets will be made available through the Internet.

INTRODUCTION

Now celebrating its 12th birthday, Singapore's biennial Festival Of Arts (FOA), organised by the National Arts Council, has established itself as one of the most comprehensive arts festivals in Asia.

The keyword in the FOA since its inception in 1977 has been the eclecticism which has become a hallmark of the Singaporean worldview: a balance between the old and new, the traditional and the contemporary and the tried and tested evergreen. In the FOA, you get to see everything: from musicians who make music from plastic tubes, theatre pieces in which actors do not talk and dance pieces that verge on natural movement, to the well-known ensembles in classical music, established theatre acts and the top dance troupes.

For FOA 1998 the catch phrase is "innovation". Some of the most exciting acts of over 30 groups (in 95 performances over 26 days) are the cutting-edge productions from Asia. They will challenge and push our perceptions of what is possible in the arts.

Established Singaporean theatre groups (such as TheatreWorks, The Necessary Stage and The Theatre Practice), whose works are characterised by slick production values, raw energy and philosophical subtexts, are guaranteed to deliver some of the most thought-provoking moments in the Festival. The legendary Cloud Gate Dance Theatre of Taiwan, which presents its breath-taking *Nine Songs*, is also set to be a high point in the Festival.

The revolutionary opera of Shanghai Beijing Opera Theatre highlights the changes of a traditional Asian art form that uniquely blends the traditional and contemporary.


Japan's Theatre Uzura and Buto-Sha Tenkei are two other groups whose unique insights into the essence of aesthetics and life are bound to change your perception of the everyday.

At the other end of the spectrum, the presence of two top symphony orchestras in the international scene today, together with a young and rising orchestra from Southeast Asia, will serve as a reminder that tradition will always have a place in our lives.

With such a line-up, the Singapore Festival Of Arts promises to be the arts festival for arts lovers to experience the new Asia in a Singapore which is witnessing an exciting development of Asian arts with a new found Asian spirit and a New Asian sensibility.

FESTIVAL VILLAGE -World of Music, Arts and Dance WOMAD at Fort Canning (28 May - 31 May)

The internationally celebrated WOMAD takes place in Singapore for the first time, as a special curtain raiser to the 1998 Festival of Arts.

WOMAD (World of Music, Arts and Dance) is a renowned producer of world music festivals which aim to highlight the varied cultures of the world. A WOMAD festival essentially gathers some of the best music and dance from all over the world, to create events that celebrate the diversity of human expression and the unifying power of music.

To date WOMAD has been responsible for more than 120 events held in 18 different countries, always attracting enthusiastic reviews from press and audiences. In the words of The Guardian, a leading UK daily, "...the strength of WOMAD has always been its blend of established artistes and the lesser known, and of traditional music with the experimental ...". The Sydney Morning Herald described it "...as close to perfection as any outdoor event could hope to be...".

And now WOMAD brings its informal, lively world music festival to Singapore, presenting



some of the world's best music and dance at Fort Canning Park, an appropriately atmospheric and historic setting - once the home of ancient kings and now a symbol of Singapore's unique rich cultural heritage. In keeping with this setting, the event will showcase a strong line-up of Asian talent.

FESTIVAL VILLAGE -World of Music, Arts and Dance **WOMAD** (28 May - 31 May)

Four different presentation areas will be created within the Park, both outdoors and under cover. Performances will begin at dusk on Thursday and end late on Sunday. Some will be largescale, and others acoustic and intimate, featuring internationally famous performers alongside artistes entirely new to Singapore.

Over four special evenings, Fort Canning Park will come alive with the rhythms and voices of the world. Audiences will get to experience the heart stirring percussion of India, the music of shepherds from Sardinia, landscapes of China in music, a haunting solo voice from Tibet, Russian classics, Irish soul, musical journeys to Madagascar, Thailand, Gambia, Hungary, Scotland, Argentina, Algeria and Indonesia.

With staggered times and separate performance areas located a comfortable walking



distance from one another, get set to enjoy as many (or as few) performances as you choose. As the music plays, wander through the Park to discover special events for children, music, and craft workshops for enthusiasts, opportunities to dance, sing and play, and plenty of food and drink. 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

Colour, energy and flamboyance are brought to mind with the mention of fiery flamenco dances. But more than that, flamenco is also a serious, developing dance form - a living art with strong roots and tradition.

Flamenco XXI Danza from Spain is led by choreographer and dancer Ricardo Franco. His long and varied experience has seen him performing classical ballets and contemporary dances with American Ballet Theatre, and the New York City Ballet, to flamenco with the Spanish National Dance Company.

For the Festival, this young and talented dance group will present a new

production, 'La Calle' (The Street) to the accompaniment of percussionists. 'Dúo' and 'De La Casa' (From The House) are solo dances intended to show off the dancers' virtuoso skill and technical brilliance.





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Tharp! Sexy. Hip. Provocative.

Comprising a set of three dances by Twyla Tharp, revolutionary leading light of postmodern American dance, this production had American critics raving when it premiered and toured the US in 1996. Since then, it has been performed at the 1997 Edinburgh and 1998 Sydney Festivals.

The dancers are all handpicked and groomed by Tharp herself. They propel themselves with incredible ease, beauty and purpose to her blend of ballet, modern dance, jazz and streetdancing. The individual pieces are in turn set to religious American choral music, cheesy retro tunes of the '50s and '60s, and to well-known contemporary American composer Philip Glass' Heroes Symphony. The result: pure Tharp.



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



Crossing Borders



A programme which crosses cultural and artistic borders by this established company, which is as well-known for its ballet productions as it is for its ventures into modern works. The triple bill features works by contemporary choreographers that explore and redefine the classical and the modern, the West and the East.

British choreographer Graham Lustig's 'Borderlines' challenges the parameters – emotional, physical and intellectual - that have come to define our lives.

'Lambarena', by San Francisco Ballet choreographer and principal character dancer Val Caniparoli, uses music which combines traditional African music with pieces by Bach. The dance is equally experimental. Said the original lead dancer of the work: "The movement is really different; it's still very much based on classical ballet technique, but it's expanded to include different kinds of contractions, isolations of the hips, and a softness of the arms."

Goh Choo San's
'Schubert Symphony', on
the other hand, breaks away from his visual
trademark of unconventional and striking
contemporary ballet. It has been said
to be a "very classical"
work in which
Goh creates clear
and open patterns, designed to celebrate

Sheer poetry in motion from the group's founding directors, well-known butoh exponents, Mutsuko Tanaka and

Ebisu Torii. In 'Nocturne', these two masters and two other dancers create an eternal and phantasmagoric world of dream and nightmare which threatens to spill over into reality. But never quite does.

When 'Nocturne' toured the US early last year it was greeted with praise. The Chicago Tribune said 'Nocturne' "bullies its

audience into a heightened consciousness. Its ongoing images, one after the other, have a haunting beauty while always managing to suggest ugliness, horror, deformity and madness too ..."

The Seattle Times called it "breathtakingly beautiful and bold."

Buto-Sha Tenkei (which means Heavenly Chickens) represents one of the three main forms of butoh, directly influenced by the founder of this Japanese contemporary dance form, Tatsumi Hijikata.



Nine Songs

Back in Singapore by popular demand, Cloud Gate Dance Theatre returns with a full-length dance drama that has taken the world by storm. Myth and reality. Present and Past. East and West. Dialectics, opposites and tensions all fuse into an explosive whole in this Taiwanese contemporary dance company's 'Nine Songs'.

The work is inspired by a cycle of poems, written about 2,400 years ago, about nature, loneliness, life and death. But choreographer and artistic director of this internationally renowned troupe, Lin Hwai-Min, also uses the text as a metaphor to address issues and incidents in the 20th century.

After the violence and power portrayed through a dance vocabulary built upon a seamless blend of languages - modern dance technique, Asian dance styles, acrobatics and natural movement - the closing image of hundreds of candles on a bare stage is simply breathtaking. When it played at Frankfurt in 1994, 'Nine Songs' was hailed as "...one of the most important dance works of our time ...".

Music from machines on wheels, sculptures with sound, a performance that lasts as long as you make it out to be:
Canada's Ensemble Karel is one act with a difference. This group of musicians makes music from specially constructed machines mounted on wheels. The electronic and acoustic sounds that emerge are like nothing you have heard before.



The show, which comprises 10 movements of between three and six minutes each, is essentially a musical fantasy in which machines embody dramatic characters. The musicians weave in and out of the audience with a game component between artists and audience. Ensemble Karel redefines performance space and the act of performance.



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

achieved its reputation during the 50year reign of its music director, the great Evgeny Mravinsky. Its recordings under Mravinsky, especially of the Shostakovich symphonies, are classics.

oncert Hall

Yuri Temirkanov, who succeeded Mravinsky as music director in 1988, belongs to the rare breed of conductor showmen. He has been known to favour extreme tempos and excessive effects. Reviewers throughout Europe and the US have all stressed the virtuosity and power of this team.

St Petersburg Philharmonic Orchestra's offering for the Festival comprises well-known symphonic works by Tchaikovsky, Rachmaninov, Dvorak. The soloists are of particular interest. Russian pianist Bella Davidovich (who plays Schumann's poetic *Piano Concerto* and Rachmaninov's virtuosic *Rhapsody On A Theme of Paganini*)

is a co-winner of the 1949 Chopin Competition and attracted much attention in 1980s. Singapore-born Seow Yit Kin plays Rachmaninov's ever-popular *Piano Concerto No.2* under the Festivals' Home-Coming Series.

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
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

The long-standing American Repertory Theatre (ART) is perhaps better known for its host of famous playwrights, directors, actors and plays than any other theatre company in the world. Sam Shepard, David Mamet, Philip Glass, Dario Fo, Robert Wilson and other famous names have worked with the Bostonbased ART since its inception in 1980. Tony Awards, The Pulitzer Prize and other illustrious awards are no



stranger to this dominant force in the world of American theatre.

ART's first play for the festival, Robert Brustein's 'Nobody Dies On Friday', is a black humour piece that takes on the relationship between famed acting teacher Lee Strasberg and his celebrated pupil, Marilyn Monroe - and the repercussions on his family.

Specially for this festival, ART will also present Sam Shepard's new play, 'When The World Was Green'. The work was commissioned by the Olympic Games Cultural Olympiad's Arts Festival and co-written with Joseph Chaikin, who also directs.

This two-person play promises Shepard's characteristic haunting plot: a profile

From a historical point of view, perhaps the most significant of the four exhibitions in this year's Festival is 'The Origins of Modern Art In France: 1880-1939' at the Singapore Art Museum. This event features over 50 paintings by the men who began it all: the Impressionists who played with light and forever altered the way we look at the world; the Symbolists who brought intellectual strength and depth into play with colour; the Cubists who studied the picture plane broken by time and light; the Surrealists and the Dadaists who sought to paint the landscape and objects of dream and the deepest recesses of our imagination.



If 'The Origins of Modern Art in France' takes you up to 1939 at the outbreak of World War II, then 'Italian Masks' is an exhibition which looks at the works of a father and son team whose artistic venture arose from the need to bring new life to an Italian cultural tradition that goes back to the Middle Ages and the ancient Romans.

ocated in the beautifully restored CHIJMES complex, an historical oasis in the heart of modern Singapore, *Stars* is really two very different restaurants.

Stars Cafe is a lively bistro-style restaurant that serves continuously from 11:30am to Midnight, seven days a week, but does not accept reservations. Be prepared to wait for a table at prime dining hours, especially on

the weekends when the music is blasting and it is standing room only at the bar.
Although the Cafe kitchen appears
rather small compared to the ample
seating, the menu is quite ambitious
and eclectic. For starters, there are a
number of first courses you can share,
including San Francisco Spring Rolls
with mango salsa and peanut curry
sauce. Or, you can begin your meal
with a savory pot of steamed mussels.

The salad menu has something for

every appetite. From the lighter Mixed Greens with Crumbled Blue Cheese or the California Caesar, to the heartier-sized Chili-Chicken Salad with corn, black beans and mango salsa, or the Grilled Salmon Salad. The variety of tastes make it tantalizingly hard to choose.

Main courses are divided into three categories — grilled, fried or baked in the pizza oven. If you're craving an individual pizza, the potato, bacon and Fontina cheese version will definitely hit the spot. And, without a doubt, the burger is the best in town. Fresh ground daily from Choice U.S. Beef, this is about as close to the real thing

as you'll find anywhere in Asia — served on a fresh house-made bun, stacked high with an assortment of condiments, and served with real French fries.

For those with "fine dining" in mind, *Stars Restaurant* upstairs is the place to go. The room is enormous with a high-curved ceiling supported by massive columns. Once a classroom, the designers have maintained the historical integrity of the building and transformed it into a very comfortable space. There isn't a bad seat in the house, but if you happen to land a table near a window overlooking the chapel, the view will add to the highlights of your evening.

Although the food in both restaurants is described as "sophisticated western cuisine," the menus are as different as the rooms themselves. For starters, the Grand Shellfish Platter (serves up to six) is a great way to stir up your appetite — with fresh oysters, crayfish, shrimp and clams, it's the perfect companion for a glass of Champagne.

For those with something more decadent in mind, try the Foie Gras Pizza with potatoes and white truffle oil, about as rich and delicious as you can imagine.

For first courses, there are several salads: Mesclun Salad with glazed pears and candied walnuts; Wood-Oven Roasted Lobster Salad and Warm Red Cabbage & Duck Confit Salad.

For main courses, the portions are abundant and the menu ranges from Pasta with Andouille Sausage and Sauteed Sea Bream on Artichoke Risotto (heavenly), to the Peppercorn Grilled U. S. Filet of Beef and the best Lamb Sirloin in town. Grilled Bacon-

wrapped Norwegian Salmon is a thick fillet nestled on a bed of wild rice.

If you manage to save any room, you can choose from a list of tempting desserts — Mango-Passion Fruit Mousse, Classic Vanilla Creme Brulee, or their signature item — the Stareo Ice Cream Sandwich.

Whether you're in the mood for something casual, something fancy or just a lively place to hang out and listen to the music of the *Stars Jazz Trio*, *Stars* is definitely the place to go in Singapore.

The restaurant and cafe are both open for lunch. The Cafe offers a more relaxed courtyard atmosphere, and the restaurant upstairs is more formal. Both places serve the same lunch menu with an Executive Set Lunch offered Monday through Friday. Proof of identity must be provided when purchasing and attending performances. Each member may purchase one ticket only for each performance.

Full-time National Service Men, SAFRA and NTUC members will be entitled to a 10% discount off all ticket prices at counter sales except for the following shows: Festival Village - WOMAD; New Orleans Rhythm Kings at the Ritz Carlton, Millenia Singapore; James Moody & Vanessa Rubin with the Jeremy Monteiro Trio and the New York Philharmonic. Proof of identity must be provided when purchasing and attending performances. Each member may purchase one ticket only for each performance.

Arts Card cardholders will enjoy 10% off any amount of purchase using the Arts Card for all bookings made during counter or phone sales except for shows to: Festival Village - WOMAD; New Orleans Rhythm Kings at the Ritz Carlton, Millenia Singapore; James Moody & Vanessa Rubin with the Jeremy Monteiro Trio and the New York Philharmonic. For package bookings, Arts Card holders can enjoy an additional 5% off except for bookings for New York Philharmonic.

Citibank cardholders and patrons with Citibank cheques will be entitled to 15% discount for the New York

Terms and Conditions of Ticket Sales

Package Bookings are only available during postal bookings from 4 - 20 April, and are not available during any other period of booking.

All tickets sold through postal, counter, phone and internet bookings are allocated on a best-available-seat basis by the SISTIC ticketing system. There will be no choice of seats. However, to help service specific needs, 2 counters at Singapore Indoor Stadium and Specialist Shopping Centre will allow choice of seats by patrons.

A handling charge of \$3 for every multiple of 8 tickets will be levied on all modes of bookings i.e. handling fee of \$3 for 1-8 tickets; \$6 for 9-16 tickets and so on. There is no handling charge for bookings made over the counter.

If the patron's choice of tickets is not available during postal bookings, the patron shall be contacted by SISTIC for alternative choices.

Tickets booked by phone will be mailed to patrons within 2 weeks. If phone booking is made within 7 days of the performance, the patron shall collect tickets at the venue before show time.

All tickets sold cannot be exchanged or refunded under any circumstances except only in the event that a performance is cancelled before its scheduled performance time.

Tickets lost after receipt due to patron's own negligence cannot be replaced. For tickets booked through mail and lost in transit, call 348 5555 for more details.


